The Meal Program - To Go/Boxed meals from the Canteen on the Union Court side of the building; drive up from 11:30-12:30pm.

Pantry - Will continue and all staff/volunteers will handle food with gloves (even pre-packaged food). We will allow people to come for food as walk in basis or scheduled appointments Monday-Friday. We will accept people at any time regardless of the guidelines we previously had in place stating you were only allowed to get food every thirty days.

**Operation Community Cares (OCC):** In an effort to consolidate scarce resources, OCC is forming partnerships with local nonprofits to support our area's most vulnerable populations and those who cannot work due to the "Safer-at-Home" order. Operation Community Cares screens and deploys volunteers who make home deliveries during this time of need for food and other basic needs items (diapers, hygiene supplies, etc.). These items are dependent on supply and demand. You are able to make 3 request(s) per month. Only 3 deliveries per address will be possible per month. Your request will be reviewed by OCC staff as soon as possible. When items are ready for delivery, an OCC representative will contact you to let you know approximately when the delivery will be made. All deliveries will be dropped off at the main entrance of the address provided. There is no charge for items or delivery. **West De Pere School District:** All students age 18 and under and persons over 18 years of age with a disability who participate in a public or private non-profit school program during the regular school year. No forms or registration are required to receive free meals. The child(ren) must be present in the vehicle or walk/bike up to receive free meals. Each site will serve breakfast and lunch. Monday - Friday 11:00am-11:45am

Notes: The limit is one breakfast bag and one lunch page per child per day. All food will be taken off-site. Families will NOT enter or eat in the buildings. For drive through locations, meals will be picked up through cars. Families will open their trunk or window to receive the meals. Locations indicated as Parked Pick-Up will have food truck delivery at that location. A line will be formed and meals will be handed to families. Servers will be wearing bright vests.

## Homeless Shelter

In addition to already established homeless shelters, there is one new shelter available during COVID-19. St. John's has opened a second shelter, located at Spring Lake Church, 301 N. Adams St, Green Bay.

## Medication Delivery

**Streu's Pharmacy** (635 Main St., Green Bay) – Delivers Monday-Saturday free of charge in the Green Bay area. Medications are typically delivered the day after they are called in (no delivery on Sunday). Call 920-437-0206 with insurance card to get started as a new customer if you want to have prescriptions transferred over.

**Walgreens:** Patients can have medications delivered via Fed Ex. Patient needs to be enrolled in pharmacy text notifications. When medication is ready, patient will receive a text asking how they want to receive the medication – in store pick up or via Fed Ex delivery. Patient clicks on option desired. Delivery is usually by the next day, but due to high volume can take a bit longer. If patient wants delivery and is not enrolled in text notifications, they can call the pharmacy to enroll in text notifications. There is a \$4.99 delivery fee is currently being waived during COVID-19 situation.

**CVS:** Currently offering delivery at no cost through US Post Office (1-2 days typical arrival time). CANNOT deliver any refrigerated medications (including Insulin) or controlled substances. Patients need to sign up for delivery through the CVS app on their smartphone or create an account online at [www.cvs.com/delivery](http://www.cvs.com/delivery) to sign up for text notifications and delivery. If a patient doesn't have smartphone or online access, they can call the store to enroll.
