SUBSIDIZED HEALTH SERVICES

Bellin Gives Back to the N.E.W. Community Clinic

A decades-old partnership continues to endure and evolve as Bellin Health and the N.E.W. Community Clinic (NEWCC) work together for the benefit of the patients and communities they serve.

The health system and clinic first came together in the 1970s, when NEWCC was known as the Green Bay Area Free Clinic, said N.E.W. Community Clinic CEO Kim Franzen.

“Our relationship with Bellin Health is steeped in history and is as important as ever today, as we continue to work together to address socioeconomic barriers and provide a continuum of healthcare services,” Franzen said. “This multifaceted partnership has grown and changed over the years, but our collective commitment to patients and community has never wavered.”

Here is a look at some of the ways Bellin and the N.E.W. Community Clinic work together:

Physician Volunteers

Bellin Health’s Dr. Cynthia Lasecki has volunteered at NEWCC for more than 20 years, bringing her Family Medicine expertise to the patients she serves there.

“As a physician, it’s important to give back to the community, and this is one great way to do that,” Lasecki said. “The N.E.W. Community Clinic provides incredibly important care to a traditionally underserved population, and I am grateful I can contribute to the fantastic work they do.”

NEWCC’s mission is to provide access to comprehensive, quality and compassionate healthcare to underserved community members — regardless of ability to pay. The clinic provides access to comprehensive primary and preventative health medical services, behavioral health services



including psychiatry, primary dental services and case management services. In 2022, NEWCC served more than 4,700 patients in its medical, dental and behavioral health clinics, accounting for more than 14,000 patient visits. The Women, Infants and Children (WIC) program provides nutritional support to women and young children at the clinic, and in 2022 served an additional 4,600-plus clients.

After-Hours Telehealth Support

For the past decade or so, Bellin’s Telehealth team has provided after-hours phone support for NEWCC, ensuring patients who call when the clinic isn’t open receive a prompt and helpful response. In 2022, that averaged out to over 130 calls a month, a valuable in-kind contribution that ensures patient needs are met any time of day.

Lab Services and More

Bellin has joined with two fellow Green Bay hospitals to provide no-cost lab services on a rotating basis. Every third month, Bellin provides these services so the N.E.W. Community Clinic’s patients don’t see a charge. This is a huge benefit that helps keep care affordable, Franzen said.

And when NEWCC implemented the Epic electronic health records system in 2015, Bellin was there to assist as a partner, helping with start-up costs and providing expertise. Having Epic provides continuity of care for NEWCC patients not just at Bellin, but also at other health systems that use the platform.

“We look forward to continuing to grow in our partnership with Bellin,” Franzen said. “Working together, we can make a difference for even more members of our awesome community.”

Drive-Thru Clinics, Boo the Flu Make Flu Shot Season Easy and Fun

As health experts warned of a severe flu season in 2022, Bellin Health created quick and fun ways for the communities it serves to get vaccinated against influenza. A combination of drive-thru and walk-in clinics opened throughout Northeast Wisconsin and the Upper Peninsula of Michigan, creating convenient and effective ways to get community members vaccinated.

Those who have had the flu know the misery it causes, as the virus weakens the immune system and can persist for days and sometimes weeks. Getting vaccinated against influenza has become more important than ever, with somewhere between five and 20 percent of the country's population getting infected. The best defense against the flu is the influenza vaccine, more commonly known as the flu shot, and Bellin works to ensure its communities have quick and easy ways to receive one.

To make these flu shot visits a more welcoming experience, clinics throughout the Bellin Health system held Boo the Flu drive-thru clinic dates. During these times, Bellin staff and team members dressed up in costumes, handed out treats and took part in Halloween festivities.

Bellin College, Marinette and Daggett all hosted Boo the Flu events, offering the same convenient drive-thru influenza vaccination, while also giving the patients a little entertainment to help scare away the flu season.

Given its success and popularity, Bellin will continue to include drive-up options and extended flu clinic hours to make it easy for community members to get vaccinated. In addition to clinics and primary care scheduling options, individuals can also visit Bellin's Fastlane drive-thru site for the quickest and most convenient way to get their flu shot.



Community members can also visit either of the two Bellin Health FastCare clinics seven days a week as a walk-in.

With a total of 10 communities holding drive-thru clinics throughout the region in 2022, Bellin has indeed made the flu shot an annual treat for its patients.

HEALTH PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION

Healthcare Academy Partnership Prepares Medical Professionals of Tomorrow

Green Bay-area high school students are exploring future careers while helping address the healthcare workforce shortage thanks to an innovative partnership between Bellin Health, Bellin College and two local school districts.



The Healthcare Academy program allows high school students, most of whom begin as sophomores, to earn up to 42 college credits at a reduced cost while receiving classroom and hands-on instruction that could pave the way for their future careers. At the same time, the program allows Bellin Health to develop promising young students into the healthcare professionals of tomorrow.

“This program is a win for the students, for the school district they attend, for Bellin College and for Bellin Health,” said Bellin Health Sports Medicine & Orthopedics Outreach Programs Director Phil Schaible. “The Healthcare Academy allows young people to explore various healthcare careers generally, or to hone in on a particular area of interest that is relevant to their future career. They can even train as Certified Nursing Assistants (CNAs) as part of the program.”

The program launched in fall 2022 with a cohort of 39 students from Luxemburg-Casco and Denmark high schools. It quickly grew to include more than 200 students from 11 schools for Fall 2023, and has the potential to grow even further, said Chad Dall, Bellin College Director of Outreach and Engagement.

“The intent of the Healthcare Academy is to help high school students find their passion in healthcare while providing a solid foundation of theory coursework and hands-on experiences,” Dall said. “There is a whole spectrum of careers in healthcare, and with the help of healthcare professionals, we can provide meaningful mentorships and job shadow opportunities to help solidify students’ interest in this field.”

One of those professionals is Dr. Derek Vaughn, a Bellin Health orthopedic surgeon specializing in hand, wrist and elbow. Vaughn presented during one of the Healthcare Academy’s symposium days, which both present information about healthcare careers generally and spotlight a particular area of medicine.

“It’s exciting to see the enthusiasm of these students, some of whom will become the healthcare professionals of tomorrow,” Vaughn said. “It’s gratifying to help bolster their interest, answer their questions and help address the healthcare workforce challenges faced both locally and nationwide. I wanted to share my simple story. I was just like them and today I am an orthopedic surgeon. I want them to know with hard work and a plan, they can achieve anything.”
